What is Service Learning?

Service Learning is a teaching method designed to involve students in authentic and meaningful service to their communities.

Service Learning is a **Work-Based Learning** experience as it provides students with career exploration activities.

High School students are encouraged to complete and document **40** hours of service learning by the end of their senior year.

How to Document Service Learning?

All middle and high school students in FCPS have access to **x2VOL** through their **Naviance Student** account.

X2VOL is an online tool schools use to support students with recording and verifying service hours electronically. Schools can also advertise service opportunities through x2VOL.



Guest Speakers are caring and responsible people who are interested in giving their time to share perspectives on what the world of work is like, the passion for what they do, and academic and career advice.

Work-Based Tours are an opportunity to learn about the careers available with a particular employer and observe the work performed by people in those careers.

College and Career Fairs are structured events that expose students to a wide range of careers and higher education and training programs.

Informational Interviews are structured interactions between a student and a professional and guided by the student's interest in learning about specific career pathways.

Developing Skills for Career Success!

Break down career clusters into pathways to identify occupation-specific knowledge and skills.

Engage in career-connected learning to advance interests and goals related to career pathways.

Service Learning are project-based learning experiences that enable students to apply academic, social, and personal skills to improve the community, develop a lifelong ethic of service, and civic engagement.

Job Shadows are opportunities for students to observe the workplace and to have one-on-one interactions with employees for more in-depth exposure to both careers and workplaces.

Externships are extended job shadow opportunities where students are paired with professionals to further explore careers and learn about the education and training required for specific careers.

Career Mentorships are opportunities for students to connect with professionals who may provide career advice, hands-on experiences which encourage the development of interests in particular career pathway(s).

Internships are workplace oriented, hands-on learning experiences for students to develop and practice career-related knowledge and skills for a specific career field related to career interests, abilities, and goals.

Develop Portrait of a Graduate and workplace readiness skills for successful postsecondary education and employment.

School-Based Enterprise is an on-going, student-managed entrepreneurial operation within the school setting to provide hands-on learning opportunities tied to an academic course of study.

Entrepreneurship provides students with opportunities to plan, implement, operate, and assume financial risks in businesses that produce goods or deliver services.

Clinical Experiences are unpaid experiential learning opportunities in health services that provide students the opportunity to combine classroom learning with clinical practice of career-related skills.

Youth Registered and Registered Apprenticeships (YRA) integrates schoolbased and work-based learning with the skilled mentorship of teachers and journey worker experts to develop employability and occupational skills.
