Upcoming events: Parent social Friday 5-6:30pm Locals Tacos & Tequila; stock the breakroom (October 25th) – SignupGenius and Amazon wish list will go out this Friday, need donations and people to volunteer to help stock the break rooms Reflections program kickoff – Hosted by the National PTA, this year's theme is "accepting imperfection," there are 6 categories, submissions are due 11/30 at midnight, need judges for the program, hoping to have an Art Night at the school for everyone to showcase their submissions, details to follow Approval of minutes from September meeting – APPROVED UNANIMOUSLY 7:55 PM Panel discussion: "Life after WSHS: How should I be preparing now?" featuring: Justine Worthington, Senior Assistant Director for Visits & Events at The George Washington University; Paul Steiner, Administrator of Adult & Community Education for FCPS; Facilitated by Jeff Toomer, WSHS Career and College Counselor; With additional advice on Fairfax County career pathways from Liz Alstatt WSHS – the majority of our students go to college, 88%, 12% do other things, military, gap year, or go straight into the workforce ACE – facilitate Behind the Wheel courses for 5500 high school students annually, provide career credentialling courses, skilled trade apprenticeship, if you are 18+, HS graduate, need 8000 hours on the job, take a course for every year that you are pursuing those hours (4 courses), can earn while you learn, classed are done through ACE, plumbing, electrical, HVAC, carpentry, heavy equipment operation, and a few others, building welding program, can start by registering for a course, and can pursue employment from there, the best part is that it's a subsidized program that results in minimal out of pocket costs College Application Process – Justine recently visited WSHS, spoke with students about the process, process is simple, even if it feels complicated, showcase yourself, why are you a great fit for the school, transcripts are important, (where did you start in 9th grade, how did you progress, what is your trajectory, are you taking advantage of what is offered to you at your school), activities section includes what you do when you're not in class, (athletics, clubs, part time job, babysitting siblings, it can look different for everyone), the essay fills in the gaps, (writing style, and a chance to hear the student's voice in their writing), and the last piece is letters of recommendation (preferably a teacher and a counselor). Admissions Counselors are looking for reasons to say YES to an applicant, give them that reason!
